**Public Safety and Licensing Committee Meeting Minutes  
Wednesday, December 10, 2025, at 6:30 PM

The Public Safety and Licensing Committee met on Wednesday, December 10, 2025, both in-person at the district office and via Zoom Video Communications. The following Board Members attended the Public Safety and Licensing Committee meeting: Nicole Carter (virtual), Margarita Espinosa, Maria Garcia, Magdamary Marcano, Jessii Parham (virtual), Reggie Powell (virtual), Paul Ramirez (virtual), Renee Reed, Carol Robinson (virtual), and Angelina Zervos.

The Public Safety and Licensing Committee discussed the following information:

- **Discussion of Liquor License Applications**

The Public Safety and Licensing Committee reviewed the liquor license renewal application for Dancing Crane Cafe and Bronx Zoo Caterers both located at 2300 Southern Boulevard. After discussing the applications, the Public Safety and Licensing Committee will issue a favorable recommendation to the New York State Liquor Authority for this establishment.

The Public Safety and Licensing Committee also reviewed the liquor license corporate change application for Caridad Seafood Restaurant located at 410 East Tremont Avenue. They were informed that the corporate change is necessary because the current owner is retiring. All business operations and management will remain exactly the same under the new ownership. After discussing the application, the Public Safety and Licensing Committee will issue a favorable recommendation to the New York State Liquor Authority for this establishment.

- **Update on Portmore Linkup Lounge**

The Public Safety and Licensing Committee was informed that the State Liquor Authority has revoked Portmore Linkup Lounge's liquor license. The reason cited was the repeated service of alcohol to underage minors, supported by video evidence of minors entering and leaving the establishment on numerous occasions. Portmore Linkup Lounge officially closed in November but retains the right to appeal the decision. The Public Safety and Licensing Committee hopes that a new, compliant business will eventually take over that location.
