Deputy Inspector McCormack stated the following:

- There was 7% increase in crime. Up 1% from last month.
- Three incidents occurred each involved shooting. One was on 187th Street and Prospect Avenue, second incident was on Beaumont Avenue, and the third incident was on 180th street. Domestic violence unit is working close with victims.
- He also announced that Captain Ordonez left to the 49th Police Precinct in exchange for Captain John Hall. Captain John Hall gave a history of his life, he will be working close with domestic violence cases.

Jay Baez from Senator Gustavo Rivera's Office, stated there will be a job fair on May 3, 2017.

Rafael Moure from Council Member Richie Torres' office informed us about the voting results for the budget.

Lieutenant Torres informed us about the Summer Youth Academy whose deadline is in June. They're also expecting a total of 150 children. Lieutenant Torres also informed us about the Citizen Police Academy for teenagers in the community. These particular sessions are usually 14 weeks, but the amount of weeks have been reduce to 6 weeks for the teenagers who are between the ages of 13 and 17 years old.
