48th Precinct Council Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, November 26 @ 7:00 PM

Location: 450 Cross Bronx Expressway

Claudette Coles, Law Enforcement Committee Chairperson

Captain Brown presented the following information at the meeting:

- Shootings are up by one in a 28 day period.
- Rapes are down by one (previously at two).
- Felonies remain the same and include grand larceny of bags left in cars.
- Burglaries are on a rise due to windows being left open on fire escapes.
- Mailbox fishings have increased. Therefore, people should not put mail in the boxes outside the Post Office.

Rebecca from Tremont Garden stated that something should be done at the McDonald's on Tremont and Arthur Avenue, as there are too many individuals hanging out, asking for money, and engaging in other activities.

Representatives from the offices of Senator Gustavo Rivera, Councilmember Ritchie Torres, and Assemblymember Victor Pichardo were also present.

- Jay Baez, representing Senator Gustavo Rivera, discussed family law.
- Rafael Moure, representing Councilmember Ritchie Torres, stated that their office is working on the loitering situation Rebecca presented earlier.
- Elba, representing Assemblymember Pichardo, mentioned that there is help for housing assistance and for the issues concerning tenants.

Meiling Viera Delgado, Director of the Community Affairs Unit, stated that the community affairs unit serves as a liaison between the District Attorney and the residents of Bronx County and coordinates with various outreach programs.

Famod Konneh, representing Mayor De Blasio, spoke about affordable housing. He said the MTA fare is fixed by .5%, and discussed the salary band, which was initiated on October 23 and disallows an employer from asking you the pay rate from prior employment.

Aida Haddock, President of the Precinct Council, stated that they're accepting donations of used coats, toys that are preferably wrapped with age and gender denoted, and food.
