48th Police Precinct Council Meeting Minutes September 25, 2018 Claudette Coles, Law Enforcement Committee Chairperson

The 48th Police Precinct is Commanding Officer is Deputy Inspector Andre M. Brown. The 48th Police Precinct sits in the heart of the Bronx, encompassing Belmont, East Tremont, and West Farms. Fordham University's campus is nestled in the precinct northern corner, the famous Arthur Avenue runs down the center, and the Cross Bronx Expressway and Crotona Park from the Southern Border.

We discussed the importance of getting to know the Neighborhood Coordination Officers. The community was encouraged to find their sector. There are four sectors in our district - A,B,C and D. The Neighborhood Coordination Officers (NCOs) serve as liaisons between the police and the community. They are given more time and opportunity to collaborate with the residents in identifying and solving local problems and crime in their assigned sectors. The Neighborhood Coordination Officers meet with their assigned sector to hear from a broad range of voices about what it will take to make all the residents of our neighborhood feel safe and secure.

The current statistics are as follow:

Rape has a 3% increase year to date, felony assault during the 28 day period has a 2% increase, murder and burglary year to date rates has a 4% increase, and the overall crime rates within a 28 day period has a 7% increase.

We were informed that Crime Prevention Officer Torres helps assisting issues with bank accounts, A.T.M devices and mailing.

He also informed us about the 5K run/walk/roll to end domestic violence on Saturday, September 29, 2018 from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM. The event will begin and end on East 161st Street between Grand Concourse and Walton Avenue.

Mr. Jay Baez representing Senator Gustavo Rivera spoke about over dose prevention. He also announced an upcoming Health and Housing workshop on October 27, 2018. They are also hosting a dinner for Veterans in November.

Ms. Romina Enea representing Council Member Ritchie Torres spoke about the drug activities that were occurring at McDonald's on East Tremont Avenue.

The Law Enforcement Explorer Program meets every Tuesday's and Friday's from 4:30 PM to 7:00 PM at the 48th Police Precinct. The Law Enforcement Explorer Program advisor is Officer Perez and she could be reached (929) 287-7279. The program provides young men and women from the city's diverse communities with an introduction to a career in law enforcement or a related field in the criminal justice system. The program, geared for ages 14 to 20, often results in strengthening ties between the community and police. Explorers are taught the importance of higher education, self-discipline, and respect for diversity and human dignity through training, involvement in community service projects, and other Exploring events.
