48th Police Precinct Council Meeting Minutes December 18, 2018 Claudette Coles, Law Enforcement Committee Chairperson

Deputy Campbell stated the following crime statistics in a 28 day period in comparison to last year:

There was an increase in felony assaults of 29 verses 26.

There was no changes in murder of 0 verses 0.

There was no changes in rape 0 verses 0.

There was an increase in robbery 25 verses 20.

There was a decrease in burglary 9 verses 11.

There was an increase in grand larceny 36 verses 11.

There was an increase in GLA 7 verses 4.

The overall total of the 28 day period decreased by 13%.

Deputy Campbell also advised the community not to leave our vehicles running. He advised that vehicles should be shut off and locked to prevent auto theft. He announced that there will a vigil for the 2363 Prospect Avenue victims.

Mr. Nicholas Peters representing Assemblyman Victor Pichardo reported that Assemblyman Pichardo has donated three million dollars to Bailey Houses for roof repairs. He also informed us the community that their offices will offering free notary services starting in January. If you need more information, please contact their district office at (718) 933-6909.

Ms. Romina Enea informed the community that Councilmember Torres introduced legislation that would make it illegal for businesses to ban cash transactions. As we approach the anniversary of the 2363 Prospect Avenue fire, their office is distributing free stove knob covers. She also informed us that there will be a mobile mammography van located on 4215 Third Avenue that will be offering free mammograms.
