48th Police Precinct Council Meeting Minutes February 26, 2019 Claudette Coles, Law Enforcement Committee Chairperson

Deputy Inspector Brown stated the following crime statistics in a 28 day period in comparison to last year: There was an increase in rape 3 verses 2.

There was an increase in crime 29 verses 28.

The overall total of the 28 day period decreased by 8%.

Deputy Inspector Brown encouraged the community members not to leave personal belongings in their vehicles because vehicle break-ins are increasing rapidly. He announced that the street renaming in honor of Lesandro "Junior" Guzman-Feliz on Bathgate Avenue and East 183rd Street will be held on Wednesday, February 27, 2019 at 10:00 AM. He also announced that the 48th Precinct Council Meetings will be held on the following days: March 26, 2019; April 30, 2019; May 28, 2019; and June 25, 2019.

During the month of February, I attended the following events and meetings:

On February 27, I attended the ceremony of the street renaming of Bathgate Avenue and East 183rd Street in honor of Lesandro "Junior" Guzman-Feliz.

On February 27th, I attended Build the Block meeting for Sector C of the 48th Precinct boundaries. The Build the Block meeting was held at 411 East 178th Street at 7:00 PM. This sector is covered by Officer Jerry George and Officer Dharlyn Vasquez. The officers informed the community members about what they have been working on in this community. Community members also had the opportunity to share their concerns about this sector.

On February 28th, I attended Build the Block meeting for Sector A of the 48th Precinct boundaries. The Build the Block meeting was held at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church at 7:00 PM. This sector is covered by Officer Michael Soto and Officer Andres Zambrano. The officers informed the community members about the responsibilities of the Neighborhood Coordination Officers. They also informed us that there were a decrease in robbery rates, an increase in sex crimes and an increase in vehicle breakins within this sector. They have made a total of 130 arrest and 13 gun recoveries. The community members also requested assistance with the Fordham University students, requested more police patrolling and a speed reducer on East 183rd Street and Belmont Avenue, and reported drug activity on Belmont Avenue and East 188th Street.

On March 5th, I attended the Quarry Ballfields Visioning Meeting at the Monterey Housing Development.
