Representatives Pascale Bernard, Phillip Rumsey and Adam Stojanavski gave a slide show presentation and stated the presentation will be sent to BXCB8 so the Board can share it.

Phil Rumsey of OCM stated there are very few legal cannabis dispensaries open right now, and the vast majority of cannabis dispensaries are conducting business illegally.

Pascale Bernard of OCM stated that all complaints about illegal cannabis dispensaries should contain as much detailed information as possible and be sent to <u>complaints@ocm.ny.gov</u>. OCM's investigation team will review all complaints but will not update people on open investigations.

231st St. (Guest) stated that the cannabis dispensaries operating illegally on 231st St are attracting undesirable elements that are being disruptive and hostile to neighborhood residents.

BXCB8 Chair Laura Spalter inquired about the role of Community Boards and NYPD, with regards to cannabis dispensary oversight and enforcement.

Myra Joyce stated the cannabis dispensaries are illegal, and asked why they aren't being shut down?

Nick Fazio stated that if illicit businesses continue to expand, they're going to put legal establishments at a significant disadvantage.

4. NYS Liquor Authority: Renewals

Sean Berry, Owner of The Punch Bowl, located at 5820 Broadway, appeared before the committee:

Lieutenant Haney of the 50th Precinct stated there have been no notable complaints about the business.

No Representative for Jakes Steakhouse, located at 6031 Broadway, appeared before the committee. The application was tabled until further notice.

5. NYPD Report (*See attached NYPD CompStat Report) -

Lieutenant Haney of the 50th Precinct, presented the NYPD report:

Lt. Haney stated the 50th Precinct is working with the Sheriff's Office to enforce the law against illegal cannabis dispensaries. The Sherriff's Office presently has more authority than NYPD to enforce laws against these establishments.

Mary Ellen Gibbs stated cars have been doing doughnuts at 236th Street and Johnson Avenue lately around 6:15pm. She stated scooters and e-bikes remain a constant danger.

Cars have been speeding and running red lights regularly on Broadway between 260th Street and Mosholu Avenue. Lt. Haney stated he would send two officers to that location for the next few days to monitor the area and hopefully deter violators.

Ed Green stated committee member Sergio Villaverde emailed him photographs of a car on Reservoir Avenue with missing tires and rims. Lt. Haney stated that area was a hot spot for catalytic converter and other auto theft robberies. Lt Haney stated he deployed additional unmarked cars and changed several officer's tours to have more personnel available overnight to monitor that area and other areas with frequent auto theft crimes.

Reports of a homeless man living in a car on Goulden Avenue near Bedford Park & 205th St. NYPD can do a wellness check, but it's not a crime to be homeless.
