Ramdat Singh called the meeting to order at 7:07pm.

### Approval of Minutes

A quorum being present, the minutes of the March 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting, were approved, 3-0.

### Chairperson's Report

The Tibbets Brook Daylighting walkthrough was amazing and very insightful. It was great to put in perspective the conceptual plan presentation and see it on a walking tour. Thank you to Stephanie and Christina from Van Cortlandt Park Alliance for this great walkthrough.

The weather is getting warmer and the Board office is receiving noise complaints. Stephanie mentioned that were a joint meeting between the 50<sup>th</sup> precinct, PEP and Van Cortlandt Park Alliance to strategize how to handle these illegal barbecuing and excessive noise complaints. The office received a complaint from Kelly field and the Board office is scheduling a meeting between CB8, NYPD, PEP and Van Cortlandt Park Alliance, to address these issues. If there any graffiti issues, please file a complaint with 311 and email the Board office the compliant number, so it can be followed up on.

Michael Ortiz, from the Department of Parks and Recreation, was invited to attend our meeting to update us on the three capital budget items in procurement. Unfortunately, Michael had a last minute emergency and was unable to attend. We will invite him to the committee meeting in June to update us on these projects.

#### Discussion of Parks and Recreation Committee Budget Priorities FY 2024

Last month, the committee discussed and created its list of both capital and expense budget items. Ramdat mentioned that there were three additional joint capital budget requests and we should include those in our budget lists.

Ramdat asked Deb Travis to present the two joint committee budget requests from Traffic and Transportation Committee.

- JOINT PARKS/TRAFF&TRANS DPR/DOT Van Cortlandt Park Bailey Pedestrian Plaza: Reconstruct Van Cortland Park South step street from Van Cortlandt Park South to Gale Place including integrating green infrastructure to capture storm water and creating a pedestrian plaza at Bailey Avenue entrance to Van Cortlandt Park
- JOINT PARKS/PUBLIC SAFETY/E&S/TRAFF&TRANS (DPR/NYPD/DEP/DOT) Jerome Park Reservoir Pedestrian Safety Lighting: Add park style lighting around the pedestrian perimeter of the Jerome Park Reservoir along

   Avenue between Sedgwick Avenue and Reservoir Avenue for pedestrian safety from

Ramdat discussed the potential joint capital budget request with Economic Development.

• JOINT- PARKS/ Economic Development – Tree Pit Guards- Install tree pit guards along commercial corridors in CB 8

The Economic Development Committee wanted to put in a joint request for beautification of the commercial corridors in CB8. The request will focus on planting trees and installing tree guards in tree pits that do not have one. Ramdat mentioned that Economic Development meets tomorrow, so they will iron out the exact locations at their meetings. The issue was raised that Department of Parks of Recreation do not actually install tree guards, but plant the trees, removes the stumps and trim the trees. The Committee recommends that Chairs of both committees, Ramdat and Nick, draft a letter to the Councilmembers asking for funding for this type of request.

The Committee decided to include the two joint budget requests with the Traffic and Transportation Committee. The Committee voted to adopt the capital and expense budget requests unanimously.
