- Car break-ins are also on the rise. O'Toole emphasized the need to lock your car, take your keys and remove packages, etc. from your car.
- DI O'Toole said that new cameras were placed along Sedgwick Avenue at Reservoir, University and Eames Avenues. Councilman Cohen's office approved \$100,000 for more cameras.

Antoya Williams of the Kingsbridge Heights Neighborhood Improvement Association asked about speed bumps on Claflin Avenue. She was advised that it is being looked at. DI O'Toole doesn't know if or when they will be installed.
