- 1. Meeting called to order at 7:05pm
- 2. Approval of February minutes Approved unanimously
- 3. Discussion of State COOG virtual conference on OML Chair and Lisa Daub attended a February 14 virtual conference hosted by the New York State Committee on Open Government (COOG) focused on the Open Meetings Law. Chair forwarded to all Board members the conference's Power Point presentation. There was a brief discussion focusing on the intent of the Open Meetings Law (OML) concerning communications (verbal and written) among Board members. The intent of the OML law is unambiguous, communications which are part of the decision-making process, are subject to OML and should be subject to public scrutiny.
- 4. Discussion of latest COIB Agreements The COIB did not share any Agreements during the past month.
- 5. Discussion of City Council Legislative spreadsheet Chair had forwarded his latest Legislative spreadsheet to committee members

- 7. New Business
  - A. Chair advised that an invitation had been sent to the Campaign Finance Board to provide a speaker to address the March 8 LRE meeting. The request is for the speaker to address and explain the implementation of the Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) that is to be

implemented for the first time, under the last City Charter revision. Special elections, like the one for our area to be held on March 23 to fill the unexpired term of Andy Cohen.

- B. There will also be a primary election to select party candidates and a November general election to elect Councilmember Cohen's full-term successor. Right now, there are six petition-accepted candidates. Only one can win. Voters need to understand that they are to vote by rank-ordering their preference. The winning candidate needs 51% of the vote as machine-scanned.
- C. If that doesn't occur, the ballots of voters for the candidate with the lowest number of number 1 votes will be rescanned to assign additional votes to their number 2 choices. This process will continue to 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> choices, as needed, until one candidate has the necessary 51%.
- D. There have already been two special elections in Queens using this system.
- E. It was suggested, as was the original plan, that the meeting be publicly announced, as the process may prove to be very confusing.
