It has been a busy summer! CB8 was happy to join the Marble Hill Houses Family Day, 50th Precinct's National Night Out and Riverdale Pride. Thank you to our communities for hosting such great events.







Congratulations to our Irving Ladimer Community Service Awardees

The award acknowledges the many volunteerefforts of groups and individuals withinour community. It is our belief that by recognizing our committed community volunteers, we can in some small way reward those most deserving and inspire others to follow their example.

Riverdale Y Jewish Community Center, Senior Volunteer Meals Program, for its outstanding efforts in helping homebound seniors during and after the pandemic by delivering meals and offering companionship to 200 senior citizens daily.

<u>Sara Allen & Selma Raven,</u> for their immediate response to the problem of food insecurity by starting the first community fridge in the Bronx, known as the Friendly Fridge. With their volunteers they direct five to seven thousand pounds of food per week into the hands of our community.

<u>Danny Monge</u>, for his outstanding work as Volunteer Coordinator of Angel Tree, an organization that hosts Christmas parties for children of incarcerated parents. During the pandemic Danny also delivered necessary supplies such as wipes, and masks to those in need. He also volunteers with Together We Can Free Communities and assisted with the restoration of the Bell Tower Memorial Flagpole honoring our veterans.

Rita Freed, for her tireless environmental efforts in single handedly cleaning, beautifying, and maintaining the green spaces on all sides of the Knolls Crescent shopping district for years.

Julie Jenkins, for initiating and guiding the volunteer cleanup effort in Ewen Park. She has raised funds, marshalled volunteers, created an organizational structure, chaired meetings, and created a calendar that brought together the community to clean and even re-claim parts of the park that have fallen victim to dumping and graffiti.

These local businesses have volunteered their efforts, exhibited superb entrepreneurship while making significant social contributions to the community and exemplifying the spirit of Betty Campbell Adams for which the award is named.

Bronx Burger House - Laura Levine-Pinedo and Andre El-Saieh – Laura Levine-Pinedo (manager) and Andre El-Saieh (owner) work tirelessly to make an impact on the community. Some of their activities include providing hot meals to Hebrew Home essential workers during the pandemic, hosting activities and celebrations for families at the Broadway Family Plaza Shelter, leading fundraising drives to help victims of fires in the Bronx, and partnering with Giving Friends, a non-profit that helps support families living in poverty and crisis.

One Yoga for All – Eduvigis Marmolejos - Eduvigis has a keen sense of the importance of community and has built inclusiveness into her business. She stands out as a business owner who promotes other minority-owned businesses in the Bronx by organizing a regular pop-up market in her yoga studio. Eduvigis offered donation-based community classes, providing yoga instruction to those who could otherwise not afford it. In doing so, she has advanced both economic growth and social justice in the Bronx during the pandemic.

Cora's Hardware – Patti Cassiere and Joe Sparacio - Patti was a founding member of the North Riverdale Merchants Association, now known as the Riverdale Main Streets Alliance. She served as treasurer for over a decade and worked diligently towards the success of businesses on the avenue. Patti and Joe, recently retired, are receiving this award for their longstanding participation in civic activities engaging the Riverdale community.

Riverdale Auto Clinic formerly Tigerdale Automotive – Jimmy Packes (posthumously) - The Riverdale Press has chronicled the many kindnesses Jimmy showered on his Riverdale customers, including front-line workers during the COVID-19 pandemic. He provided dedicated and friendly service to all, often recognizing customer financial limitations. Mr. Packes enticed other merchants to remain in our community and enhanced economic growth. Jimmy's warmth and dedication to the community will be long remembered, even as we mourn his passing in January 2022 at age 83.

In February the process is followed again when the Board reviews the Mayor's responses & preliminary budget for the coming fiscal year. Protect Yourself and Others From Monkeypox



Do not have sex or other intimate contact if you or your partners have a new rash or sores, feel sick, or were recently exposed to monkeypox. Ask your partners whether they have monkeypox symptoms and about their recent sexual history.



Frequently wash your hands, bedding, towels and other shared items. Sex toys should be washed after each use or sex act.



Get vaccinated if you may have been recently exposed to monkeypox. To find a vaccination site, visit **nyc.gov/vaccinefinder**.



Talk to your health care provider about testing, pain management or treatment if you have monkeypox symptoms. If you do not have a provider, call **311** to get connected to care.
