**WHEREAS** Ahmed Al Saedi, Representative of Trendy Threads, located at 206 West 231<sup>st</sup> Street, appeared before the Public Safety Committee on December 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023, to apply for a Cannabis Retail Dispensary Premises License.

**WHEREAS** the applicant stated he is presently operating an illegal smoke shop at the same address he is applying for a cannabis license.

WHEREAS the Public Safety Committee voted unanimously to disapprove this application.

### PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE RESOLUTION OPPOSITION TO CITY COUNCIL INTRO BILL NO. 586 DECEMBER 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023

**WHEREAS** New York City Council Intro 586 is a legislative bill that proposes all Level 1 interactions with the public would require a separate report be filed each time a New York City Police Officer makes an inquiry; and,

**WHEREAS** level 1 encounters are considered police interactions where an individual is not suspected of a crime, an individual's help is being sought by a Police Officer, or an Officer is seeking to help an individual; and,

**WHEREAS** examples of a level 1 encounter include: Police Officers looking for a missing child in a park, Officers asking subway riders about a crime in progress, Detectives asking neighborhood residents about a crime in the area, Officers asking a store owner if everything is alright; and,

**WHEREAS** bill 586 would require Police Officers to report on the race, ethnicity, gender, and age of every person involved, and detail the circumstances surrounding each Level 1 encounter; and,

**WHEREAS** a Federal Court rejected a previous effort to require Officers to complete additional paperwork and found that imposing these requirements on police officers were unnecessary; and,

**WHEREAS** bill 586 sends a message to the New York City Police Department that Officers are not to be trusted with the most fundamental aspects of their profession; and,

**WHEREAS** Bronx District Attorney Darcel Clark opposes Intro No. 586, citing that this law would cause "longer response times and fewer positive interactions between police and the public."

**WHEREAS** New York City Mayor Eric Adams vehemently opposes Intro No. 586 and has publicly sworn to veto it, saying "It will endanger public safety."

**WHEREAS,** Bronx Community Board 8 Public Safety Committee strongly opposes New York City Council Intro No. 586 bill and requests our City Council Representatives Carmen De La Rosa, Eric Dinowitz and Pierina Ana Sanchez publicly voice their opposition to the bill and vote against it.

**Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED** Bronx Community Board 8 strongly opposes New York City Council Intro No. 586 bill and requests our City Council Representatives Carmen De La Rosa, Eric Dinowitz and Pierina Ana Sanchez publicly voice their opposition to the bill and vote against it.

### TRAFFIC & TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE SAPO RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS,** the SAR Academy (the Applicant), 655 W 254<sup>th</sup> Street, Bronx, NY 10471, presented its request to obtain a Street Activity Permit (SAPO) in connection with its 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration to be held at the campus located at 503 W 259<sup>th</sup> Street, Bronx, NY 10471 on Saturday, February 3, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant requested to restrict curb lane usage on W 259<sup>th</sup> Street between Riverdale Avenue and Netherland Avenue and 259<sup>th</sup> Street and the dead-end street of Netherland Avenue on Saturday, February 3, 2024 from 7:00am to 11:30pm; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has not requested to restrict vehicular traffic.

**WHEREAS,** the Traffic and Transportation Committee of Community Board 8, Bronx, unanimously supports the issuance of a permit to the SAR Academy for the curb lane restrictions on W 259<sup>th</sup> Street between Riverdale Avenue and Netherland Avenue and Netherland Avenue and 259<sup>th</sup> Street and the dead-end street of Netherland Avenue on Saturday, February 3, 2024 from 7:00am to 11:30pm.

### RESOLUTION CB #8 Housing Committee

**WHEREAS,** the *City of Yes—Economic Opportunities* includes a section on allowing commercial development on "campuses", and

**WHEREAS,** a portion of this "campus" section permits up to 15,000 SF of commercial development on the ground floor of New York City Housing Authority developments in residentially-zoned districts, and

WHEREAS, Marble Hill Houses and Fort Independence Street Apartments in CB #8 are zoned R6 with no commercial overlay, and

**WHEREAS**, the Housing Committee of CB #8 discussed this proposal with committee and community members at its November 27th committee meeting, and

**WHEREAS,** members expressed concern about resulting increased truck traffic from both deliveries and refuse removal, extended hours of operation and signage with or without illumination.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Housing Committee finds that the proposal to include 15,000 SF of commercial development in NYCHA developments is incompatible with a residentially-zoned and residentially-developed NYCHA neighborhoods, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that such commercial development will be detrimental to the quiet enjoyment of the developments, is unnecessary and offers no benefits to the developments, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Housing Committee opposes the Department of City Planning's proposal to allow commercial development in the residential buildings of NYCHA developments.
