Report from the NYPD 50th Precinct

Commanding Officer Captain Amadeo Oktrova gave the police report. For the month, decrease in crime by 11.9%, 89 vs. 101, compared to last year during the same period. 2 homicides in the confines of the precinct – one was a murder-suicide indoors and the other occurred on West 242nd Street and Broadway. Down in rapes, 1 vs. 3. Up in robberies, 10 vs. 9. Felony assaults down, 15 vs. 19. Burglaries down, 7 vs. 14. Grand Larcenies Down, 37 vs. 42. Up in auto thefts, 22 vs. 19.

The total budget is \$282,534 and it is broken down by Personal Services (PS) and Other than Personal Services (OTPS). The total OTPS budget is \$48,267 and there is \$42,535 left in the OTPS budget. A breakdown of the various object codes in the OTPS budget was announced in Table 1.1. \$0 in requested funds and \$0 in encumbered funds. \$3,456 remains in the Rent and Energy Detail. We have allocated the rest of the money (\$52,169.48) for the office rent to allow us to continue paying through December 2026.

Alongside Economic Development Committee Chair C. Barnes-Watson, interviewed by News 12 the Bronx regarding the empty storefronts on Knolls-Crescent area.

Conducted a review with XYZ Live to go over their maps on the retail spaces in our district.

Attended the RiverSpring Living and the Riverdale Construction Advisory Committee meeting along with community residents regarding the construction on their site.

Presentation on ADA capabilities in playgrounds, dog runs, pools, etc. Asked for the state of the Van Cortlandt Park Stadium – hoping for a presentation from NYC Parks in March. Seton Park Dog Run also discussed. Bronx Parks Speak Up event will be on February 28th at Lehman College. The next Parks & Recreation Committee meeting will be on February 26th where budget priorities and the Parks Resource Guide will be discussed.

b) Law, Rules & Ethics – S. Villaverde gave the report in the absence of M. Wolpoff and S. Froot. A large part of what is being worked on is the bylaws changes that were discussed earlier. Working group on board restructuring that is reporting to the committee sent out emails to board members. Plan to have a report by next month. The next Law, Rules & Ethics Committee meeting will be on March 9th.

d) Housing – The last meeting was on December 22nd. The New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) gave a presentation on Good Cause Eviction. The next Housing Committee meeting will be on February 23rd where the budget will be discussed and a New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) representative will discuss the Permanent Affordability Commitment Together (PACT) program.

e) Health, Hospitals & Social Services – The committee met on January 14th. NYS Gustavo Rivera, Chair of the NYS Senate Committee on Health, attended and spoke about the New York Health Act. The next Health, Hospitals & Social Services Committee meeting will be on February 11th where the Alzheimer’s Association will be making a presentation. Received notification today that Mosaic Health is planning to move into the former Jewish Board offices on West 239th Street and Henry Hudson Parkway. The Board has to issue a resolution or letter of support to the Department of Health. Hoping Mosaic Health will attend tomorrow’s meeting to discuss their plans.

f) Environment & Sanitation – Discussed snow removal in the district at the last meeting. The next Environment & Sanitation Committee meeting will be on February 18th. SAPO application on the agenda for a small business outreach mobile unit on Johnson Avenue.

g) Education Libraries & Cultural Affairs – Refer to the meeting minutes of January 27th. The next Education Libraries & Cultural Affairs Committee meeting will be on February 24th.

h) Economic Development – Attended the tenants meeting on January 29th at Knolls-Crescent regarding the vacant storefronts. Follow-up meeting on February 22nd to learn more about organizing and supporting the merchants there. Met with Live XYZ team to learn about geo-mapping to support the planning fellow. The committee met on January 6th and had a presentation by NYC Free Tax Prep and the Kingsbridge Armory. Refer to the meeting minutes. The next Economic Development Committee meeting is to be determined (TBD).

i) Budget – Expected to receive city agency responses on January 26th, however since it is a transition for the NYC Mayor’s office, there is an extension and the response will be on February 17th. As such, the Budget Committee will hold a public hearing in March, before the Regular Board meeting. Reached out to the community on budget ideas and suggestions for Fiscal Year 2028. We received some ideas and suggestions and emailed them to committee chairs last week. Please review and discuss with your committee members.

j) Aging – The committee met on January 8th. Discussed the resource guide. The next Aging Committee meeting will be on February 12th at 4PM. NYC Council Member Susan Zhuang, Chair of the NYC Council Committee on Aging, will attend and the committee will discuss budget requests.

k) Special Committee on Veterans’ Services (SCVS) – The next SCVS meeting will be on February 26th. The committee will discuss the annual veterans event at Memorial Grove, the awardee, and timing.

l) Special Committee on Racial Equity (SCRE) –The next SCRE meeting will be on March 5th to discuss draft documents for June Interim Report. As SCRE priorities over the last several years have been to increase CB8 visibility in all corners of the district, increase community agency and partnering with City agencies in problem solving, ensure residents receive equitable services, and improve the quality of life across the district. Potential presentation on new division, NYC Mayor’s Office of Mass Engagement.

CM Dinowitz is now the Chair of the NYC Council Committee on Education. Held first hearing today on Mayoral Control. The Governor has proposed extending Mayoral Control for four years. Voted Co-Chair of the Antisemitism Task Force. 5 point plan to combat

antisemitism. Key Food at the Skyview Shopping Center closed rather quickly. Met with the landlord and the Riverdale Main Street Alliance (RMSA). U.S. Congress Member Ritchie Torres, Borough President Gibson and Assembly Member Dinowitz have joined the efforts and a new supermarket will now be opening in the coming months.
