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INTRODUCTION

The annual Statements of Community District Needs (CD Needs Statements) and the Community Board Budget Requests (Budget Requests) are Charter requirements and an integral part of the City's budget process. When developed through informed planning and careful consideration, CD Needs Statements and Budget Requests can play an important role in consultations of community boards with agencies, elected officials and other key stakeholders on a broad range of local planning and budget priorities. These tools also provide a valuable public resource for neighborhood planning and research purposes, and are used by a wide audience seeking information about New York City's diverse communities.

This year, for the first time, community boards electronically submitted a CD Needs Statement combined with their Budget Requests. The goal of these improvements is to simplify preparation of both documents for the community boards and to make the information community boards provide more easily accessible for City agencies and other stakeholders. Simplified and more efficient processes will allow all parties involved in the budget process to consider budget decisions more thoroughly, with better results for all New Yorkers.

2. OVERVIEW OF COMMUNITY DISTRICT

Bronx Community Board 8 provided the following overview of their district:

Bronx Community Board 8 covers a total area of 3,4 miles and is comprised of neighborhoods in the Bronx, and a portion of Manhattan called Marble Hill with 8,500 residents (Manhattan census track 309). The Bronx neighborhoods are the Historic District of Fieldston, Kingsbridge, Kingsbridge Heights, Riverdale (North and South), Spuyten Duyvil, and Van Cortlandt Village. All BXCB 8 neighborhoods receive municipal services from the Bronx such as police, fire, sanitation, senior services, education, and traffic and transportation.

There are three NYCHA locations in BXCB 8 which are the Marble Hill, Ft. Independence, and Bailey Avenue Houses which house almost 3,500 low income residents. In addition there are 26,376 total persons on either Cash Assistance (TANF), SSI, or Medicaid only, which represents 25.9 percent of the district population as per NYCDCP 2014 information. The most recent NYCDCP vital statistics reporting show the number of births in 2012 at 1,185 an 11.6 percent increase over the previous reporting of 1,116 in 2005. The number of deaths in 2012 at 994 down 9.8 percent from the previous reporting of 1,122 in 2005. As our death rate continues to decrease the average age of BXCB 8 is increasing, Our senior population over the age of 60 in 2013 was 21%, in 2014 22%, it is now over 23% of our total population and continues to grow each year. Our senior citizens are living longer, and need more services that are not always being provided or cut.

BXCB 8 includes such significant open space assets such as Wave Hill, the Jerome Park Reservoir, Riverdale Special Nature District, Fieldston Historical District, and Van Cortlandt park. With 1,386 acres of parkland (63 percent of the the community board area) there are 68 park sites including smaller Greenstreets as well as Van Cortlandt park with its 1,146 acres of parkland. These park sites are constantly in need of mantinance and many of our budget requests are for improvements to our parks which are natural resources to all New York City residents.

The infrastructure in many parts of BXCB 8 needs to be updated as sewer overflow problems during storms are occurring causing backflow into the streets, sinkholes have begun to appear in some areas of the community board (due to either underground water/sewer main structural problems, or defects in the street road bed due to heavy traffic loads), and the current milling and repaving schedule of our streets can not keep up with our street repair needs.

Our schools are at or above capacity with after school programs and building upgrades needed at every school in the community board. In addition the Marble Hill neighborhood was rezoned into Manhattan NAB 12 from Bronx NAB 8 by DYCD while the Marble Hill neighborhood continues to be part of Bronx Community Board 8.

3. MAIN ISSUES

As part of this year's process, community boards were asked to select from a list the three most pressing issues facing their district. Bronx Community Board 8 identified the following three issues:

- Parks
- Senior services
- Street conditions

Bronx Community Board 8 provided the following explanation for their choices:

Senior Services - As our population ages more services are going to be needed for our senior. Currently many of our senior centers operate on minimal services to our seniors due to continuous budget flatlining or cutbacks including the loss of DYCD funding to senior centers when DYCD rezoned most of BXCB 8 out of NAB 8. Street Conditions - Con Edison did a major Oil to Natural Gas conversion of a majority of the apartment buildings in BXCB 8. While they laid down new High Pressure gas line under our streets the work was done mostly by contractors who the Public Service Commission said were 70 percent untrained to do the work, and many of our streets now show that the statement fron the PSC to be true. In addition to sewer cave ins, sink holes, and pot holes that continue to increase in size the current DOT program of Milling and repaving can not keep up with the current rate of street decay. Parks - 63 percent of BXCB 8 is parkland. The Parks Department has come up with a master plan for Van Cortlandt Park, but this can not be done because there is no funding available, Many areas of VCP are in need of repair especial the stadium area that is still being used which was condemed. Other parks need repairs that have been on our Budget request for several years now also,

BXCB 8 is home to many individual group homes for various organizations who house various mentaly developed disabled people. There are clusters of these units in North Riverdale where homes were purchased in the past, and now apartments are being rented. It is a family setting where several individuals are placed with supervision, but we are now finding that the settings are not always best for the individuals. It is the opinion of the chair of the Health and Hospitals Committee that BXCB 8 is oversaturated with these units.
