## C. Composition of Land Use committee

Suggestion for bylaws change

The Land Use Committee shall be a standing committee of the Board. Only currently serving duly appointed members of the Board shall be eligible to serve on the Committee. Those Board Members who elect to join the Committee shall be subject to its regular attendance requirements as a condition of continuing membership on the Committee. A quorum of committee members is required. However, all Board members, whether or not also members of the Land Use Committee, shall have the right to participate fully, including the right to vote, with respect to substantive matters presented, following public hearing, issues related to zoning, landmarks and ULURP matters, provided that such Board Members were present at the relevant public hearing.

To the extent permitted by the City Charter and other applicable laws, the Land Use Committee shall be authorized to speak for and on behalf of the full Board, following, and pursuant to,

- A. a Land Use Committee vote on an issue as to which there is a time limit for Board response to a City agency, providing the following conditions have been met:
- B. All Board Members will receive notice of the Land Use Committee meeting and such notice will include language indicating that the full Board may not have an opportunity to timely vote on the issue and that the Committee decision may therefore constitute the Board's position;
- C. The mandated time limit for Board input to the relevant City agency will expire between the date of the Land Use Committee vote and the date of the next regularly scheduled Board meeting; and The Board Chairperson has informed the Land Use Committee Chair, by the date of the Land Use Committee vote, that no special Board meeting will be called to consider the issue, and the participants in the Committee meeting are made aware of this information prior to the Committee vote.

Committee members were asked to review the above suggestion and offer comments. The item will be raised again at the December meeting.

D. Guidelines for co-naming streets for businesses (yes or no) Resolution offered:

WHEREAS, Bronx Community Board 8 has discussed whether the Board should consider requests for the co-naming of a street for a profit or non-profit within the Community District; and,

WHEREAS, Bronx Community Board 8 is concerned that there may be a perception that the Board, a city agency, may be promoting or advertising a particular business in the Community District by issuing a Resolution in support of a street co-naming for that particular business; Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, Bronx Community Board 8 shall not consider the conaming of a street for a profit or non-profit business in the Community District.
