The minutes of the meeting of March 23, 2010 were approved.

The Vice Chair's report:

Announced and distributed flyers on Riverfest-June 13, 2010.

In conjunction with the Health committee the survey findings were distributed and they indicated our area does not advertise tobacco advertisements at children's eye level, hence no action or volunteers are needed.

Mayor Bloomberg and Chancellor Klein have decided to remove teachers from "rubber rooms" and put them back to work.

NY Magazine article listing Riverdale #38 as desirable location to live and said we have "subpar" schools. The Riverdale Review had a front page article on same topic last week. Riverdale school have not kept their ranking high as it was in the past. We agreed the article was subjective. We do not know what data they used to come to their conclusions.

PS 7 underutilized at present but rumors that a Charter School will be housed on Corlear Avenue.

Charter Schools vs. Public Schools

Will invite new Principal of PS 24 to come and make a presentation to the committee. Have our meeting at PS 7 to find out how the G&T program is doing for the students.

Have our meetings at local schools so that Principals, teachers and parents would be more apt to attend.

Be aware of health issues with regard to the flu season and have a meeting if necessary.

All schools received a letter from the Education Committee requesting that the schools indicate needed repairs under #2 item on the committee's Capital Budget Priorities. Five schools responded sighting a variety of needs.

2. The immediate inspection of all public schools by the School Construction Authority for repairs needed, infrastructural defects and PCB contamination.

3. Funding for after-school educational/recreational arts programs, in particular remediation and enrichment programs for all of the schools in Community Board No. 8 including non-Title No. 1 schools.

4. Allocations of funds to provide for a meaningful reduction of class size in all grades.

5. Complete the staffing of a full-time nurse, librarian, guidance counselor, a computer instructor (with lab technicians for science and computer labs) for every school.


