1) Bronx Department of Transportation Commissioner Moran spoke about the delay in the construction of the 252^{nd} Street Bridge overpass. The new completion date is 4/8/08.

2) Mark Levine, Principal of P.S. 24 requests that 236th Street between Hudson Manor Terrace and Independence Avenue be made one way eastbound. Hopefully this will ensure the safety of the children.

3) 50^{th} Precinct Detective Louie Rodriguez requests a street renaming in memory of police officer Neil Forester. He requested that 236^{th} Street be renamed in his honor. Motion made and seconded – all in favor – 0 opposed.

4) Captain Timothy Callahan is requesting limited parking "from the corner, to a distance that will allow ladder 52 to make the following turns safely", West 227th, West 230th, West 231st, West 235th, and West 236th Streets onto the Henry Hudson Parkway.

5) Residents request a traffic study on 259th Street and Netherland Avenue. There is a safety concern with people crossing the street to the shopping center and the school.

6) Henry Hudson Bridge lower level replacement roadway work starts June 4th.

a) Beginning at 10:00 a.m. Monday, June 4th, one southbound Henry Hudson Bridge roadway lane will be permanently closed for long term construction leaving 3 lanes available for peak traffic times. In addition a second lane will be closed from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

b) Beginning at 7:00 a.m. on Monday, June 4th, the Henry Hudson Bridge sidewalk will be closed through project completion scheduled for late spring 2010. An upper level promenade may be accessed from the east side of the Kappock Street underpass. There will be no access to Manhattan.

7) The Committee supports the resolution in support of Henry Hudson Parkway corridor management plan for the scenic by way.
